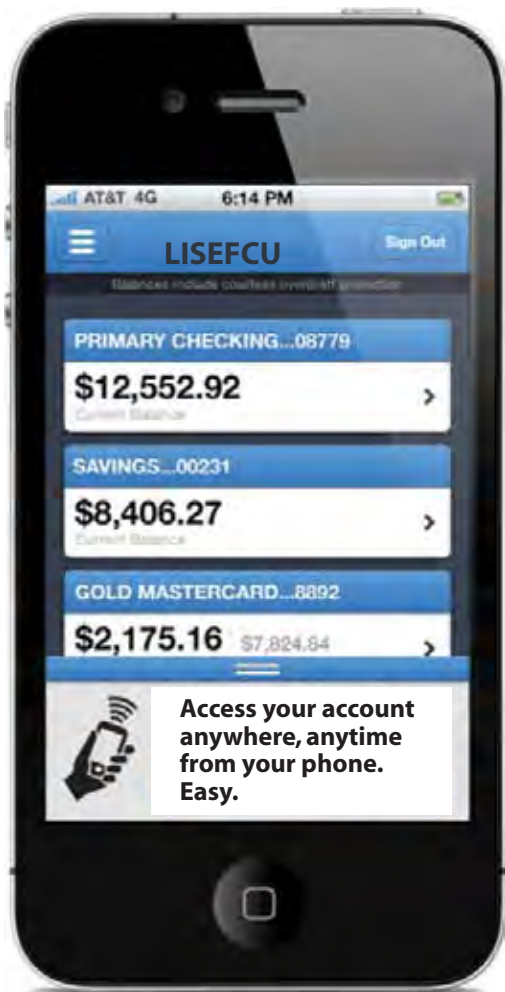

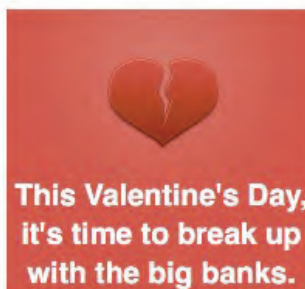
1. Find our app (LISEFCU) in the App Store

TAX IDENTITY THEFT AWARENESS WEEK

Do you know the warning signs that an identity thief is using your Social Security number?

Tax identity thieves may use your Social Security number to get a tax refund or a job. If the IRS sends you a notice saying their records show:

You were paid by an employer you don't know, or
More than one tax return was filed using your Social Security number,
contact the IRS Identity Protection Specialized Unit at 1-800-908-4490.

What Steps Can You Take To Prevent Tax Identity Theft?

1. Get an Identity Protection PIN (IP PIN) from the IRS.

(PIN is a six-digit number assigned to eligible taxpayers that helps prevent the misuse of your Social Security number on fraudulent federal income tax returns.)

2. Check your mail and credit union account statements every month.

3. Monitor your credit reports on a regular basis.

4. Visit MyCreditUnion.gov

MyCreditUnion.gov and Pocket Center, NCUA's financial literacy microsite, offer a wide range of informational articles on finance, fraud prevention, as well as multiple financial tools and resources. Keep up to date with current hot topics on fraud prevention, savings, and debt reduction.

This software is designed to protect you against spyware or malware, which can extract private information from your computer without your knowledge. Set these programs to auto-update to avoid missing a critical update.

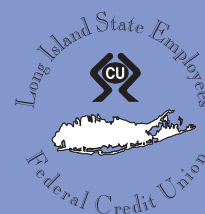


**Password-protect
